

Syllabus Update

The TA's and I look forward to working with each one of you towards a successful and smooth learning experience. Below are some indications on how we plan to proceed to this end. Please understand that *we may have to revise plans* as we gain experience.

- We will keep using all previous communication media, that is:
 - [Canvas](#) for publishing grades
 - [Handin](#) for submitting homework
 - [Piazza](#) for announcements and for off-line discussions and Q&A
 - [Class website](#) for class information and schedule. *The schedule will be updated as class progresses depending on our progress.*
- The lectures will consist of short videos to be viewed asynchronously, at your convenience, but you are strongly encouraged to keep the same hours as we did at the beginning of the semester.
- The TAs and myself will keep the same office hours and will be available on Zoom (see below).
- Exams and quizzes will be conducted synchronously:
 - The midterm is scheduled on **Friday, April 3rd, from 12:30—2:30PM** (two hours), CDT.
 - The final exam is schedule on **Monday, May 4th, from 3:30—5:30 PM** (two hours), CDT.
 - The quizzes are scheduled during the recitation, **every Monday from 1:30—2:00PM**, CDT.
 - To familiarize you with the system for the exams/quizzes, Quiz 8, on Monday, March 30, 2020 will be open for 24 hours (that is, until Tuesday, March 31, 2020, 1:30 PM, CDT). After this first experience, all future quizzes and exams will be synchronous, strictly as indicated above.
 - Quizzes and exams will need [Lockdown Browser](#) and a webcam to complete. To take an exam, you will need to start the [Lockdown Browser](#), log to the course's Canvas page, and look for the quiz.
 - Ensure that you are in an environment without interruptions or distractions and that you have enough time to complete the exams and quizzes.
 - When providing an answer on Canvas, you can add mathematical equations with the 'square root of x' button. You can switch to advance mode to simply type latex equations.
 - Use the first quiz to familiarize yourself with Lockdown Browser as it will be used to complete the midterm and final exams.
- **You need to install ASAP** the following systems and familiarize yourself with using them by watching tutorial videos or researching the internet:
 - [Duo authentication](#), which you may not need now but will need in the future.
 - [Zoom](#): An online meeting platform that we will use for office hours and for online discussions. For more details about Zoom than you would need, please refer [to the instructions of the Information Technology Services \(ITS\) at UNL](#).
 - [Lockdown Browser](#), which you need to download and install for synchronous exams and quizzes.
 - Adobe scan (optional but recommended): To scan your homework with your cell phone in case you are handwriting your homework. Download Adobe Scan on your phone; create a free account on Adobe.com; link the Adobe Scan to your Adobe.com account. All scans will be immediately sent to the cloud and will not be stored on your phone.
- More systems:
 - [VidGrid](#): The system used to record the lectures. You do not really need to use the system unless you want to share a video with us or comment on one of our videos. Make sure to use

the “Entreprise” option and use your huskers.unl.edu email address to log to the system so that you can enjoy that ‘privileges’ your status. VidGrid allows me to see who viewed each video, when, and at what level of details, which will be used to ‘compute’ the perfect-attendance bonus.
