



What are digital libraries?

- Machine-readable resources; accessible via computers
- May imclude digital representations of physical content and/or born-digital items (items that do not have a physical representation)
- Curated, scoped
- Community/communities-specific
- Storage system as well as access system (information retrieval)
- Since the mid-1990s, have evolved from indexes and abstracts to include full-text (or full image, etc.) retrieval
